We start the year in a social manner with visits to some Kennedy pubs.


### **PUB QUIZ**

# RESEARCH FOR THE NEXT KENNEDY BOOK "The Upper Ormond Kennedys – Their claims to Tipperary soil?"

Last month we wrote of the landholdings of the Upper Ormond Kennedys as recorded in The Civil Survey of 1654.

On The Projected Plantation of Ormond by King Charles I By John P. Prendergast, Esq., Barrister-At-Law.

It mattered little, however, to the Irish proprietors of the Ormonds, and other northern baronies, that the projected plantation of English Protestants was not carried out in 1640. They had but a short respite, and were soon involved in a calamity that included alike the old English of the South Riding, and the Irish of the North Riding. In 1652 the war consequent on the great rebellion being near its close, the parliament of England, by their ordinance of the 12th August of that year, reciting that their arms had been so far successful that the total reducement of Ireland might, with God's blessing, be speedily effected, " and to the end that the people might know that it was not the intention of the Parliament to extirpate that whole nation, by their said ordinance proclaimed pardon "to all husbandmen, ploughmen, and others of inferior sort, not possessed of lands or goods exceeding ten pounds;" but announced that all others " who had not shewn their constant good affection to the Parliament of England," should be banished, some to foreign parts, the rest should quit their estates and receive allotments for their support " wherever the Parliament of England, in order to the more effectual settlement of the peace of the nation, should think fit to appoint."

In accordance with this announcement there issued from the commissioners of the parliament for the government of Ireland, on the 14th October, 1653, an order that all who were not included in the parliament's mercy, should, themselves and their families, transplant beyond the Shannon before the 1st May following, under penalty of being shot to death by martial law if found after that date, without a pass, in any of the other three provinces.

In the meantime, their estates were surveyed and Down-admeasured by Dr. Petty, for the satisfying the arrears of pay due to the soldiery.

There were 62 Kennedy landholders listed for Upper Ormond in The Civil Survey of 1654. We reported last month that, after much calculation from complicated information in that survey we have been able to establish the actual amounts of land owned by all Kennedys in Upper Ormond in 1640. All landholders with possessions worth more than 10 pounds were required to transplant to Connacht.

However, much to my surprise after reviewing the results of the calculations, **41 of the 62 Kennedy landholders did not possess land worth more than ten pounds.** 

Two-thirds of the Upper Ormond Kennedy landholders qualified for a pardon and were not required to transplant to Connacht. However, they still lost their lands. It appears that they stayed on to work their previously-owned lands for the Cromwellian grantees or did so on nearby lands.

An abbreviated summary of these Kennedys is provided in alphabetical order below. Some have more than one landholding but the total value does not exceed ten pounds.

#### HISTORICAL CORRECTION

The availability of computers and calculators in modern times has facilitated the process of preparation of statistical information. They were not available to the esteemed Dr. Dermot Gleeson when he wrote his very important work on the O'Kennedys – "The Last Lords of Ormond". Dr. Gleeson's contention that *Daniel O'Kennedy of Ballintotty castle is clearly the largest owner of land* requires correction.

By calculating and summarising the various holdings in the Civil Survey it can be seen that Daniel O'Kennedy personally held less than 900 acres in 14 townlands. It can also be observed that Rory O'Kennedy of Killowney held over 1400 acres in nine townlands.

When referring to these two men Dr. Gleeson suggested: It may well be that one of these is the last O'Kennedy Donn in the Gaelic polity and the other the inheritor in English law of the possessions of the chief.
