
Chief Rody Kennedy

elcome to this edition of the Kennedy Heritage Group Mailing List. New members are being included regularly and we are very pleased to list them. The Kennedy Heritage Group is now well underway towards management of group control of Irish Kennedy heritage and the development of the resource of Kennedy research.

The latest book "The Upper Ormond Kennedys – Their Claims to Tipperary Soil" is now available. In Ireland it can be obtained from Chief Rody Kennedy at Kennedy's Shop and Bar in Rearcross, Tipperary. Drop in and have a chat with Rody and Ann while collecting your copy. They will be very pleased to see you. Work has now begun on "The Lower Ormond Kennedys – Further Claims to Tipperary Soil". This is a massive undertaking and it is hoped to have it available for launching in the middle of 2016.

For those of us not familiar with the territory it can sometimes be confusing to see that Lower Ormond is to the North and Upper Ormond is to the South. This is not the normal map convention but is related to the elevation of the land. Samuel Lewis comes to the rescue in his Topographical Dictionary of Ireland, 1837. In the picture we can clearly see that Upper Ormond has a lot of high ground while Lower Ormond is on the plains beside Lough Derg.



FINDING THE HOME PLACE

One of the great joys of family history research is finding your home place. After searching for many years Tom Kennedy of Derk, Pallasgreen, County Limerick, was able to walk into the cottage where his great grandfather William was born in 1842. Now converted into a barn with the old thatched roof gone and the building roofed in tin, the old cottage is still there at Foilycleara, high in the mountains on the Tipperary border.

It was my great privilege to take the photograph of Tom standing outside the cottage for the first time on the day I showed him where my great grandfather Martin was born. Yes – we discovered our great grandfathers were brothers and we were third cousins.

The message about family history research is to never give up, there is always something more to find.



THE NAME BRIAN, BRYEN, BRYAN KENNEDY IN ORMOND

Brian was the youngest of the twelve sons King Ceineidi of North Munster, the founder of the Irish Kennedy family. As Brian Boru he was the last great Ard Ri or High King of Ireland.

Subject: Your book on the Kennedys

Dear Mr. Kennedy

I have been researching for my family tree and your book has been a wonderful source of information for me. You even have an appendix 2 devoted to my aunt Maura Ryan's (Barracks) research and other information from my uncle Tom Ryan (Barracks).

I was wondering if in the course of your research you found out any information on another relative of mine, who died in Australia at the age of 112. His name was Frederick William/Timothy Harrington. His brother, John, married an Ellen Kennedy in 1848. I know that John and Ellen's daughter, Winnie, married a Martin Murphy and lived in Kilmore, but I don't know where John and Ellen lived.

Frederick Harrington apparently was a Governor in Australia and would have been born around 1800-1820 judging by the marriage date of his brother John and his niece Winnie was born in 1851. There were 9 siblings. I have tried unsuccessfully to find out any information on Frederick and am hoping that you came across his name during your research. If you are able to give my any information or even an idea of where I could look next, I would be extremely grateful. I don't know what Australian state he was in. It is also possible that his brother Tom emigrated to Australia.

I was also wondering if you had thought of doing a similar book for the Ryans. It would be wonderful to see that.

I hope you do not mind me emailing you. Looking forward to hearing from you.

Have you come across the following Kennedys?

Catherine Kennedy (1816) of Gleninchnaveigh, Upperchurch, Co Tipperary who married Michael Hughes in (1858). Both are buried in Dolla Cemetery and Ellen Kennedy of same address who married John Harrington in (1848) and buried in Dolla Cemetery. My understanding is that they lived around Curreeney area. Catherine and Ellen Kennedy are sisters of my great, grandfather Condy Kennedy.

Please ask if anyone has anyone got information on them.
