

From Australia to Borrisokane, Co. Tipperary – back home after 135 years

The Kennedy siblings, Karen, Desley and Glenn left Australia in August 2018, to visit Ireland and to pay our respects to our Irish Heritage. Our great grandfather John Henry Kennedy immigrated to Australia with his brother Matthew and sister Mary in 1883. We knew they came from the small town of Borrisokane in County Tipperary.

A few weeks before leaving Australia we contacted Tom at the Irish Kennedy Heritage Group. We can't thank Tom Kennedy and his friend Sean Egan enough for welcoming us to Borrisokane. We met Tom and Sean at the Catholic cemetery and the most amazing day of our journey began with a visit to the farmhouse where John Henry was born. Michael Heenan, the farmer now owning the land took the time to show us the farmhouse and give us a tour of the farm. We felt very privileged to have the opportunity to see and experience the birth place of John Henry. It was like finding and connecting with our deeper roots, a truly unforgettable experience.

The Kennedys in Tipperary have a long, long history in the area dating back almost 1000 years and we were astounded to find there were 19 castles belonging to the Kennedy clan dotted around Lower Ormond. Our next stop was Lackeen castle. Wow Wow Wow Tom told us the history of the castle (that we videoed to share with our family at home) and we climbed to the top of the castle. The feeling of touching the smooth stone walking up the spiral stairway sent tingles down my spine and imagining the lives of Kennedys that lived and fought to protect their family and lands was inspiring. Cromwell has a lot to answer for. Luckily for the Kennedys eventually returned to this castle after the invasions.

We continued on to visit a nearby cemetery where more of our ancestors were laid to rest. It was important to us to visit these sites because that's what we were here to do. With all that we had seen, achieved and experienced this day we were so happy. We could not imagine what was to come next. Tom had a final surprise for us "Corporate seats" at a Hurling match (what an exciting game it was) and a later meeting arranged with our living Irish relatives.

The Kennedy family in Australia place great value in family and looking after each other. Our father Tom Kennedy is the youngest of 12 children and his grandfather, John Henry had died 16 years before he was born. Until we met Tom (Irish Kennedy heritage group), we had no idea that we still had living relatives in Ireland. Tom showed us a copy of a letter dated the 26th March 1923 it was sent to Uncle Mick from Mary Guinea (our dads aunt?) informing the family in Ireland of John Henry's passing. We believe this is the last contact the Australian Kennedys had with the Irish Kennedys.

We were so excited as 8pm approached, the time the meeting was arranged for at the Green Bar Borrisokane. What would we say and how do we react? What would they think of us? How we wished our Dad (who always wanted to visit Ireland) could be here with us.

Uncle Mick (82) arrived first dressed impeccably, relying on a walking stick and with a twinkle in his eye, (he looked so much like our Pop it was uncanny.) He soon had a whiskey in his hand and a story to tell. Uncle Mick was such a charming, happy chap and greeted us in true Kennedy style with a kiss, hug and a tear in his eye.

Aunty Peg (96) was next to arrive, what an amazingly beautiful and knowledgeable woman. After hugs and kisses all round, the first thing she said to Glenn was you're a real Kennedy (we're not sure if it's the ears or nose) Karen felt an instant connection with her and did not leave her side all night. It was so wonderful to listen to their stories and make the connections with our Irish family after all this time. I was so overwhelmed by the whole experience. I was either laughing hysterically or close to tears for the entire evening. We saw the letter and photos Peg had brought along to show. It was a very emotional day and evening. We feel incredibly fortunate to have had this incredible experience arranged for us. We also met Sheila Ryan and in all the excitement we forgot to find out how we're related. There'll plenty of time for that as we intend to keep in contact.

As we now know Ireland is an amazing country and we have seen some amazingly beautiful places and met some incredible people but the highlight of our trip was our visit to Borrisokane, County Tipperary. To be able to connect with our relatives and discover our history. A very big THANK YOU to Tom Kennedy from the Irish Kennedy Heritage Group and his friend Sean.

AN HISTORIC O'KENNEDY LAMENT

In a remote and difficult to access area in an ancient O'Kennedy castle, several Kennedy descendants were recently privileged to see an inscription in the form of a lament. (A **lament** is a passionate expression of grief over a loss).

Apparently dating from A.D. 1657, in the aftermath of the Cromwellian dispossessions in which most Kennedys lost their lands in Ormond, the inscription is in Latin and, as such, is open to a degree of interpretation.


I have arrived at what I consider to be the gist of the relatively short lament after looking at a range of possibilities of translation.


The inscription is attributed to a direct descendant of the Lords of Ormond. In it, the writer of the lament expressed his consideration of the extent of the change that had taken place in his previous situation as a major O'Kennedy landholder and the strangeness and surprise of the situation in which he found himself in 1657.

In keeping with the necessity for material of this nature to be carefully protected, the Irish Office of Public Works has this well in hand.
