


Chief Rody Kennedy

Fáilte / Welcome.

Greetings and best wishes to all members of our Irish Kennedy Heritage Group with a special "céad mile fáilte" to our new members –

- Peter Kennedy, lives in Payson, Arizona, U.S.A. His great grandfather Patrick Kennedy emigrated from Minard West, Dingle Peninsula, Co. Kerry to Iowa between 1850 and 1870. Peter visited Ireland in September and made his way from the Kennedy homestead in Wexford to the Kennedy Heritage display in Nenagh and on to the land of his great grandfather in Co. Kerry.
- Colleen Bergin travelled from Melbourne, Australia to Ballyhane, Templederry Co. Tipperary, from where her great grandfather emigrated in the late 19th century. Colleen has already traced the diverse paths travelled by the descendants of her great grandfather John Kennedy and his siblings Winifred, Mary and Catherine. A fascinating account of their family history has been put together in a booklet entitled "The Kennedys Tipperary to Red Streak 1860s 2002". Colleen generously gave me a copy which will now be displayed in our Kennedy Display in The Heritage Centre in Nenagh.

- Noel Buckley is descended from the Kennedys of Cooga, Upperchurch and closely related to the Kennedys of Garravane which guarantees him plenty of cousins in this Irish Kennedy Heritage group.

Brian, of course will be launching his latest Kennedy history book – this one dealing with the Kennedys in the Baronies immediately adjoining Ormond, at the gathering.

Fr. Rody.

Many members of the I.K.H.G. will hear occasional references to Fr. Rody.

Monsignor Roger Kennedy, to give him his full title, was born at Knocknamoheragh, near Toor, Newport, County Tipperary. His parents, Tim and Mary Kennedy both came from farming backgrounds – Mary being Mary Ryan (Rogers) from Kilcommon. Due to the untimely death of his mother his early education saw him move from Toor National School to Cahernahallia National School, near Doon where he resided with his Aunt. He then attended Doon Christian Brother's School and after his Leaving Cert went to St. Patrick's College, Thurles where he studied for the priesthood. Ordained in 1941 for the Diocese of Maitland, New South Wales he was unable to travel to Australia because of the War and ministered in the Diocese of Cashel & Emly. During those years in Thurles Rody developed a keen interest in local history and collected folklore for the Irish Folklore Commission. He studied parish and school records and amassed a wealth of local knowledge which he recorded in his enthralling book "From Bun Ciamalta Vale to New South Wales"

Fr. Rody eventually arrived in New South Wales in 1943. He served in six different parishes and in 1951 he was appointed as a Monsignor. With the Irish Kennedy farming blood coursing through his veins, Monsignor Roger involved himself in acquiring land for these parishes. He fostered strong links with politicians and planning officials to progress the building of schools and churches for the betterment of his parishioners. Despite his deep commitment to his work in New South Wales Fr. Rody never lost contact with his roots or the people of Bun Ciamalta.

He retired from his ministry in 1991 and died three years later in 1994.




Fr. Rody "From Bun Ciamalta Vale to New South Wales"

IRISH KENNEDYS BOOKS


