We continue to attract correspondence from Kennedys far and near hoping that the I.K.H.G. can help them with their family history. Read a very short summary of their Kennedy history underneath-

• Virginia Mc Donald, lives in Anchorage, Alaska.

Her 2nd ggrandmother Sarah Kennedy was born in Quebec in 1824 and traces her ancestry back to Long Andrew Kennedy. Sarah married a Leonard Henry Hill who was born in Ireland in 1816. Sarah's parents may have been William Kennedy, born in Tipperary in 1791 and Elizabeth Latham born 1797.

• John Kennedy, now lives in London, U.K but most of his family are in Co. Louth

John's research has taken him back to the townsland of **Bealaclave**, near Rearcross and a Brien Kennedy born in 1854, son of Patrick Kennedy. I suspect there are Kennedys still around the Bealaclave/ Rearcross area who may have some knowledge of John's family history.

• Mary Kennedy has joined us from Camarillo, California via Chicago.

She believes that her gggrandfather Kennedy was one of 3 siblings who arrived in the U.S.A, in 1863 from the Nenagh area. She has very little information so far on her Kennedy history but does know that she has many DNA links on Mark Kennedy's Limerick/Tipperary tree.

• Roger Hoffman lives in Fort Collins, Colorado, U.S.A.

He has many Ryan and Kennedy ancestry including a Thomas Ryan, Coumbeg, Upperchurch who married a Bridget Kennedy. He also mentions Big Nellie Kennedy in his family history.

Ireland - 100 Years Ago.

In my previous newsletter I took you back 100 years to 1920 and the Irish War of Independence. It had started in Jan 1919 and when we left it in June 1920 the British had introduced the infamous Black and Tans to Ireland to wreak their campaign of terror in a vain effort to suppress the Irish. The war continued to intensify through the remainder of 1920. Three I.R.A. prisoners died on hunger strike, one of them was Terence McSwiney, the Lord Mayor of Cork whose death provoked international outrage against the British. Other notable events that contributed to further sympathy for the Irish case for Independence was the hanging of 18 year old Kevin Barry in Mountjoy jail in Dublin cf, Kevin Barry,

and an event that became known as Bloody Sunday in which Tipperary was centrally involved. A Gaelic Football match was arranged for Croke Park, Dublin to raise funds for the support of Republican prisoners. Tipperary and Dublin were the participating teams. While the match was still in progress a column of British Army armoured cars drove on to the pitch and randomly opened fire. 14 people were killed including the Tipperary goalkeeper Michael Hogan, after whom the Hogan Stand in Croke Park is named. Another 70 people were wounded.

The G.A.A. had detailed plans in place this year to commemorate that match, including staging a football match between Tipperary and Dublin with both teams wearing a replica of the jerseys worn in 1920 -Covid 19 has unfortunately put paid to those plans.

The war raged on for the rest of 1920 with atrocities committed by both sides and no prospect of peace.

Time travel back 100 years to Ireland would not be a pleasant experience- will continue the story in future newsletters.
