Donnchadh Ó Cinnéide R.I.P.

We begin this newsletter with the sad news of the passing of Donnchadh Ó Cinnéide. Donnchadh took over the Chairmanship of the I.K.H.G committee in 2019 and proved a most able, efficient and affable chairperson. He had a keen interest in history in general and in Irish Kennedy history in particular. He was steeped in Irish culture with a great love of the Irish language and Irish music. He was very active in promotion of all things Gaelic, exemplified by his work with Ceomhaltas and his energetic endeavour in the establishment of Brú Ború cultural centre in Cashel. He was very active in his local parish of Boherlahan-Dualla, near Cashel, never shying away from lending a weekly hand. He was most at home sitting in front of a microphone in Tipp Mid West radio station playing the music of local and national traditional musicians and singers. He interviewed Brian Patrick Kennedy live on air on all of Brian's visits to Ireland and those lucky enough to attend our last full gathering in 2019 will remember Donnchadh delivering a few lovely old Irish songs to an appreciative audience in John Benny's pub in Dingle.

Donnchadh passed peacefully in his home on 9th August, On behalf of I.K.H.G. I want to express our sympathy to Donnchadh's family and to his partner Ann. Ar dheis Dé go raibh a anam.

Irish Kennedy Clan Gathering 2023.

Irish Folklore

Following on from my piece about Irish folklore in last newsletter this piece was forwarded to me by Jim Kennedy.

This story was compiled by a school child in Newport for a project in 1930s.

There is a holy well in Cragg. Cragg is situated about 2 miles to the N.W. of Newport. A stream which rises in Ballinahinch about 2 miles distant, disappeared about 200 yards above the wall, and re-appears, forming the well, about 30 yards N.E. of the old graveyard. The river continues on though Shower Bog and thence to the Mulcair. Over the well stands an enormous ash tree, whose protecting branches, with those of adjacent whitethorn trees practically overshadow the well, affording shelter to the numerous pilgrims who make their "rounds" of the well and pray for the intercession of the Saints in order to be relieved of their bodily or mental ailments. The "rounds" are 7 in number. The pilgrim first takes 7 pebbles from the running stream, recites the Pater Noster, Hail Mary, Creed and Gloria, then throws the pebbles into the well, and walks round the well, passing through the churchyard to the front of the well where the pilgrims kneel and pray. The well is decorated with offerings of beads, sacred pictures etc left there by pilgrims on completion of their rounds. According to legend the well was in ancient times situated close to St. Cominet's bed, but as cattle were being allowed into it the well moved.

The above piece taken from the Irish Folklore Commission and supplied by Jim Kennedy. Jim Kennedy lives with his wife Kathy near Sacramento, California, U.S.A. He can trace his roots back to Hugh Kennedy of Glencroe (1716-1776) and his family lived in a house they called Cragg

House near Birdhill, Newport from 1840 to 1880. He recently visited North Tipperary and travelled to many areas of Kennedy interest on his trip.

Looking back 100 years -Ireland in August/ September 1922

I left my look back at Ireland of 100 years ago with the outbreak of Civil War between those against the Treaty with Britain which had been ratified by Dail Eireann and those on the pro treaty side. This war continued with increased ferocity through the summer of 1922. The main towns of Munster – Cork, Limerick and Waterford were brought back under the control of the Free State Army. The anti-treaty forces resorted to a guerrilla campaign and in an ambush in August 1922 General Michael Collins was killed in west Cork. Collins, as head of the I.R.A Intelligence unit had been hugely influential in the success of the War of Independence and had also been a key negotiator of the Treaty. His death brought a sense of shock to the whole country but the Civil War continued nonetheless.

IRISH KENNEDYS BOOKS

Brian Patrick is continuing his work on "The Resilience of the Irish Kennedys". Covid 19 has hampered progress of this book but it is expected to be available in 2023.

However, Brian Patrick and his oldest son, Terrence Brian, are working on another book that will dramatically change the perspective on the history of the Irish Kennedys. They are collaborating on writing a new book "Our Irish Kennedy Y-DNA Roots — Early northern Tipperary origins in the first millenium". There were Kennedys in North Tipperary earlier than Cinneidi, stepfather of Brian Boru. The following passage is from the new book:

The science of Y DNA provides a startling fresh perspective on our Kennedy family resilience and origins. Not only does it provide a new way of looking at the diverse nature of what constitutes being a Kennedy but when combined with

extant historical records it provides a new and rich understanding of Kennedy connections and origins in Northern Tipperary in the first millennium that date back well before the birth of Christ. This new baseline also allows further insights to be drawn from our current understanding of the family history in the second millennium.

So these will then be added to the impressive list of publications by Brian already available.


In the meantime "The Ryans of Ireland"- from their origins in Uí Dróna and Uí Cheinnselaig is now available from the bookshops listed below..




























Data Protection Regulations.
